Squash History

Part 1 of 5

Squash developed from at least five other sports involving racquets, gloves, and balls having roots in the early 12th century in France. It is stated that "Squash, with its element of hitting balls against walls, was for entertainment. For example, boys and girls slapped their balls in narrow alleys and streets". Religious institutions in France, such as monasteries, developed a similar game. Monks used gloves that were webbed to hit balls against a fishing net strung across the middle of the courtyards of the monasteries. This developed the early "racquets" used in tennis and squash. Then in late fifteenth century, tennis was developed and spread to other European nations.

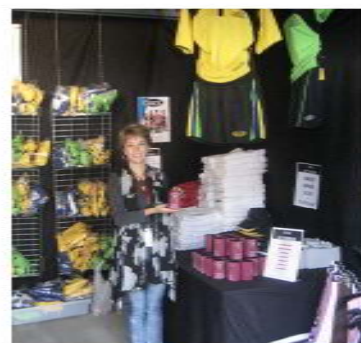
